Notes from the Gilham PTC

Dear Gilham Families,

It is hard to believe that November is here and Thanksgiving and Christmas are right around the corner. The PTC would like to thank all of you and your kids for making the Jog-a-Thon fundraiser a huge success. You helped raise around \$11,000.00 that will go directly to technology for Gilham. We will keep you posted in the coming months on the technology items the teachers and school choose to purchase this year.

COOKIE DOUGH:

The Otis Spunkmeyer Cookie Dough sale is currently underway. This fundraiser replaced the Sally Foster fundraiser that we have done in years past. Due to the changes in the Sally Foster program, we chose to go with just cookie dough this year. All cookie dough orders are due to the school by Monday, November 8th. The cookie dough will be delivered to the school on Friday, December 3rd. Pickup times are from 5:00 to 7:00 pm. The dough must remain frozen so we will send out many reminders to make sure pick-up goes smoothly.

ABSENT OR LATE

Thank you to all those parents who remember to call the office when your child is absent or late. Please help us ensure the safety of your child by calling the office before 8:15 a.m. on the day your child is absent. If your child is late, have him/her check in at the office before going to class. The attendance line number is 541-790-6225.

SICKNESS
If your child has not been fever free in the last 24 hours, please keep your child home. If your child is not well enough to participate in school

(recess, P.E., etc.), please keep your child home.

Elementary schools do not have a full-time school nurse on site. If your child complains of feeling ill, we need to call you to decide what we should do since we cannot diagnose symptoms.

LOST ITEMS

Please label all items brought to school with your child's name. All lost clothing items are placed in the lost and found shelves located in the main hallway. Smaller items like watches, glasses, etc. are kept in the office.

If your child has not been fever free in the last 24 hours, please keep them home.

HEALTH SERVICES

Gilham does not have a school nurse. First aid is provided by those staff members who hold first aid cards. Emergencies are handled by Med Express or through 911. Please do not send children to school for medical services; staff is only first aid trained. The Sheldon High School Clinic is our local resource and parent may call 541-790-6644 for information.

MEDICINE DURING SCHOOL HOURS

Oregon law and district policy require all medication, (including over-the-counter cough drops, ibuprophen, etc.) to be administered in the office from the original con-

tainer. We must have a Health Service Medication Form filled out and signed by the parent. We will be happy to send one home with your child or you may stop by the office and fill one out.

MEDICATION: NO HANDWRITTEN NOTES

For the safety of all children, no child is allowed to carry medication (inhalers and bee sting kits are exceptions if registered with the office and with parent or physician written instructions).

School personnel will accept changes in the medication dosage or time only with a

new properly labeled pharmacy container reflecting the changes in dosage and/or time administered. Amoxicillin and other medications requiring three doses a day ARE NOT GIVEN at school. Please make arrangements to have the second dose given after school.

If you have any questions regarding medication procedures, please call the office at 541-790-6200.



PICKING UP YOUR CHILD EARLY

Please do not call the office to have your child wait for you in the office. We will call your child to the office when you arrive to sign him/her out. You are welcome to send a note to let your teacher know why your child is leaving. Please allow yourself extra time to get your child from his/her classroom.

MOVING: CHANGE OF ADDRESS

Please notify the main office of any changes including address, work or home phone numbers, or emergency contact information.

It is essential that we know how to reach you in case of an emergency. It is also good practice for children to know where you can be reached.

STUDENT/PARENT CONTACT INFORMATION

Please refer to your Gilham Directory. Do not call the school asking for information. School District policy prohibits school personnel from giving out a student's or parent's phone number or address. We have school directories in the office you can purchase for \$4.00. These

will be available for the 2010/2011 school year in mid November.

SCHOOL INFORMATION AVAILABLE FOR NON-CUSTODIAL PARENTS

Head Lice — the rest of the story...



With this in mind we hope all parents check their child for head lice.

Head lice infestations have been around since recorded time. Here are some facts about head lice. They do not jump or fly. While transmission at school happens, the more likely places are sleepovers, sharing of combs, brushes, hats, and when children have their head where a person with live lice has been. What also happens is that the eggs (nits) attach to hair shaft and then by normal activity the hair dislodges from the head, egg hatches and the newly hatched louse hunts for a place to live. The newly hatched louse has about 48 hours to find a host. It takes about 5 to 7 days for newly hatched louse to become mature enough to lay eggs.

Schools have dealt with lice in a variety of ways for years. Here is what we do at this school. If a parent notifies the school that their student has lice we ask the parent to check the student in at the office after treatment. The school secretary or nurse will go through the student's head with parent present to let

parent know what they find. The parent will be encouraged regardless of results to continue combing hair with good lice comb, long, fine tooth prongs (at least 1.5 inches).

The purpose of the school nurse will always be to help educate the parents about how to eradicate the head lice and minimize spread at school. The nurse also has products available if you can't afford treatment. This school doesn't send home notification of every case of lice for a variety of reasons.

Treatment of head lice is a long, labor intensive process. Please don't expect to eradicate overnight. Nix is a good product that will kill the live bugs and 85% of the eggs. The product is applied to damp hair, left on for 10 minutes and then rinsed off. The active ingredient leaves a residue on the scalp and when the bugs try and eat they will ingest the toxic chemical and die. Try and not wash hair for several days after treatment to leave that residue to kill newly hatched lice.

Manual removal of nits is important because 15% of these are viable. This is where a really good comb is important and the comb that comes with Nix is not good. There are at least 2 "natural" products that come with an excellent comb, or a comb such as Licemeister can be purchased separately. Hair should be combed daily to help remove nits and any live bugs before they are mature enough to lay eggs. Do NOT buy RID, it doesn't work.

Another important part of treatment is vacuuming wherever you think your child's hair may have been shed and another person might also put their head i.e. car, couch etc. Obviously combs and brushes need washing in hot sudsy water. Also important is bedding and clothes. Sheets need washing and dryer time.

MESSAGES FOR YOUR CHILDREN

Because of the increasing growth of our school, we seek your help in asking that you not call during the day to make arrangements for your child.

Please note: We will give messages to students if they are of an emergency nature. We will not interrupt a class for reminders.

Our primary purpose is to protect the classroom instruction time. Interrupting the classroom for messages disrupts this instruction time. In order to give one student a message, we are required to disrupt all students.

Please plan ahead. If you are worried your child will forget some important information, send a written note with your student for the teacher.

Messages received after 1:30 p.m. are NOT guaranteed to reach the student. Please call in the morning if possible. We realize this is not always possible.

SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAM

Hot lunch prices this year will be \$2.25 for hot lunch and \$.50 for milk. Breakfast will be served beginning at 7:30 a.m. and the cost is \$1.20. Deposits may be made to your child's lunch account in the office or in the kitchen before school.

Please contact the kitchen before 10:30 a.m. with any questions about your child's account. The kitchen staff will notify you when the account is running low

by sending a notice home with your student. Please check your child's backpack and homework packet on Friday for this and other important information.

For students whose family income is limited, there is a government-sponsored free or reduced-price lunch program which depends on annual family income. If you think your family might be entitled to this service, please fill out an application form mailed earlier or pick up one in the office. We are unable to offer a free or reduced lunch the day the application is turned in. 4J Food Services will contact you when your application is approved.

Adult lunches are \$3.00. Stop by and have lunch with your child anytime!

GILHAM ELEMENTARY HEAD LICE POLICY

Goal: To keep school free of lice and to eradicate the presence of lice in our school and on our children while maintaining dignity, health and education.

If a child is found to have lice, his or her parents will be notified and the child will be sent home.

The parent will be provided written instructions for suggested treatment and prevention. The Gilham School Library has books for reference.

Parent Responsibilities

- Treatment
- Prevention
- Recheck at office before re-admit (Parent must accompany child's return to school.)
- Continued daily monitoring
- Re-treat in seven to ten days as per directions on product

Other

- No sharing combs/brushes
- No exchanging clothing/hats
- No sitting close together with heads touching
- No sharing costumes/wigs
- No dress up toys unless easily washable
